

Joint **ENSMOV** and **streamSAVE** workshop

Dealing with additionality in the context of Article 7 EED: Experiences about monitoring and energy savings calculations

Tuesday 15 February 2022, 2.00 to 3.30 pm CET ; online

[ENSMOV](#) and [streamSAVE](#) are two Horizon 2020 projects both dealing with the implementation of the Energy Efficiency Directive (EED), and more specifically its Article 7. **Additionality** is one of the key principles for the implementation of Article 7 EED and related Annex V, and also one of the most challenging:

“The savings shall be shown to be additional to those that would have occurred in any event without the activity of the obligated, participating or entrusted parties, or implementing public authorities. To determine the savings that can be claimed as additional, Member States shall have regard to how energy use and demand would evolve in the absence of the policy measure in question by taking into account at least the following factors: energy consumption trends, changes in consumer behaviour, technological progress and changes caused by other measures implemented at Union and national level”. (EED Annex V (2)(a))

This online workshop will discuss these challenges and how to address them, through practical examples. The examples will deal with both levels, action and policy.

streamSAVE is a 36-month Horizon 2020 project aiming to streamline energy savings calculations under Articles 3 and 7 of the Energy Efficiency Directive (EED). For more details, see: www.streamsave.eu

streamSAVE develops, tests and implements calculation methodologies for a selection of energy saving action types. These Priority Actions are selected according to Member States' priorities and needs, also considering their savings potentials.

A key component of the project is to facilitate discussions and experience sharing among stakeholders about key issues related to the energy savings calculations for the selected Priority Actions. streamSAVE thus gathers experts and policy officers from various EU Member States to discuss in dialogue meetings (focused on given Priority Actions) and workshops (about cross-cutting issues).
