What is the role for energy savings obligation in alleviating Energy Poverty?



Energy poverty is increasing, made worse by Russia's war in Ukraine. Energy efficiency can be a key vehicle to help relieve the cost for all households, particularly those on low-incomes. Based on a joint policy guide from Horizon 2020 ENSMOV and SocialWatt projects, this webinar provides an overview of the proposal for a new energy savings obligation requirement in the EED currently under negotiation, which would require Member States to devote a proportion of savings to households in need. The webinar considers what this implies for Member States and provides lessons from countries where energy efficiency obligation schemes are used to alleviate energy poverty.

How to set up and manage an energy efficiency fund?

Article 7 of the EED is one of the most important instruments for achieving the ambitious European energy efficiency targets. It allows the use of an Energy Efficiency Fund which can receive amounts from payments of obligated parties (or market participants) and the public budget to finance energy efficiency actions to generate required energy savings. Providing financing and cost effectiveness by design are key to the financial sustainability of Art. 7 policies. Tackling split incentives: a European outlook

Split incentives refer to any situation where the benefits of a transaction do not accrue to the actor who pays for the transaction, so if the actor who invests in energy efficiency measures (landlord or building owner) is not the same as the actor who reaps the financial benefits (tenant). Little progress towards effective solutions has been made by current public policy interventions to align incentives and concerned actors. The Horizon 2020 projects ENSMOV and ENPOR organized a lunch talk to discuss and present practical recommendations on how EU countries can overcome problems arising from split incentives.
