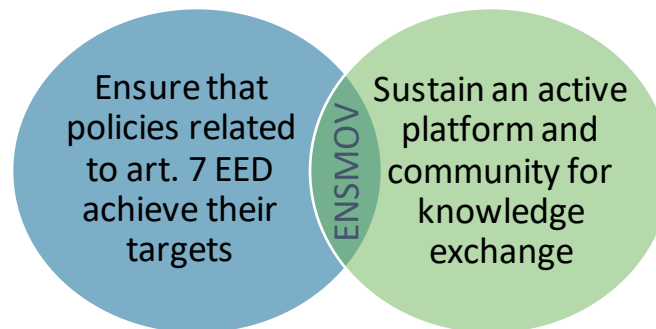
Objectives:

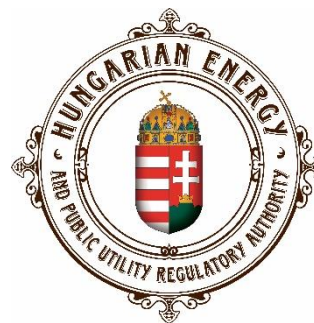

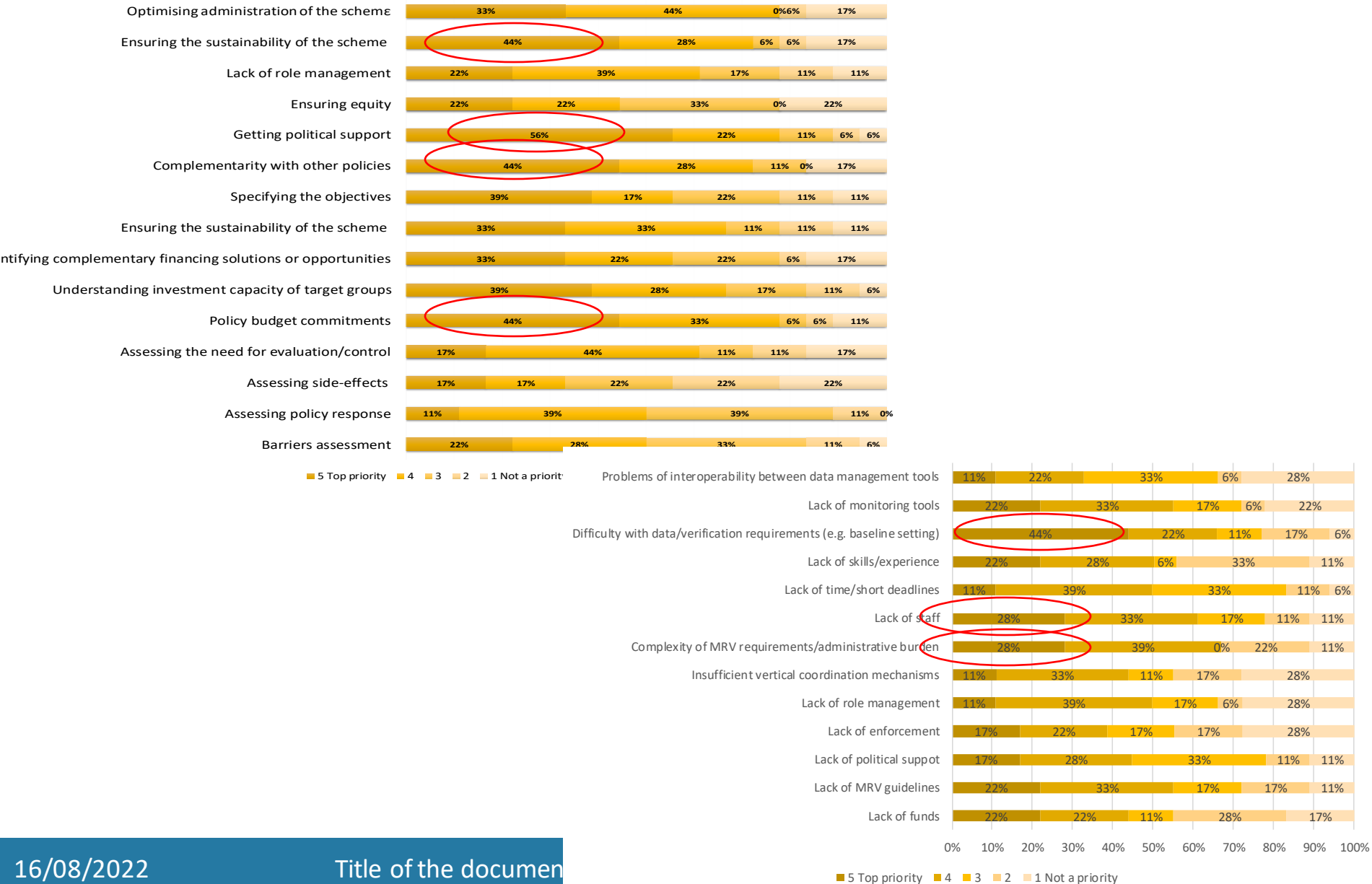

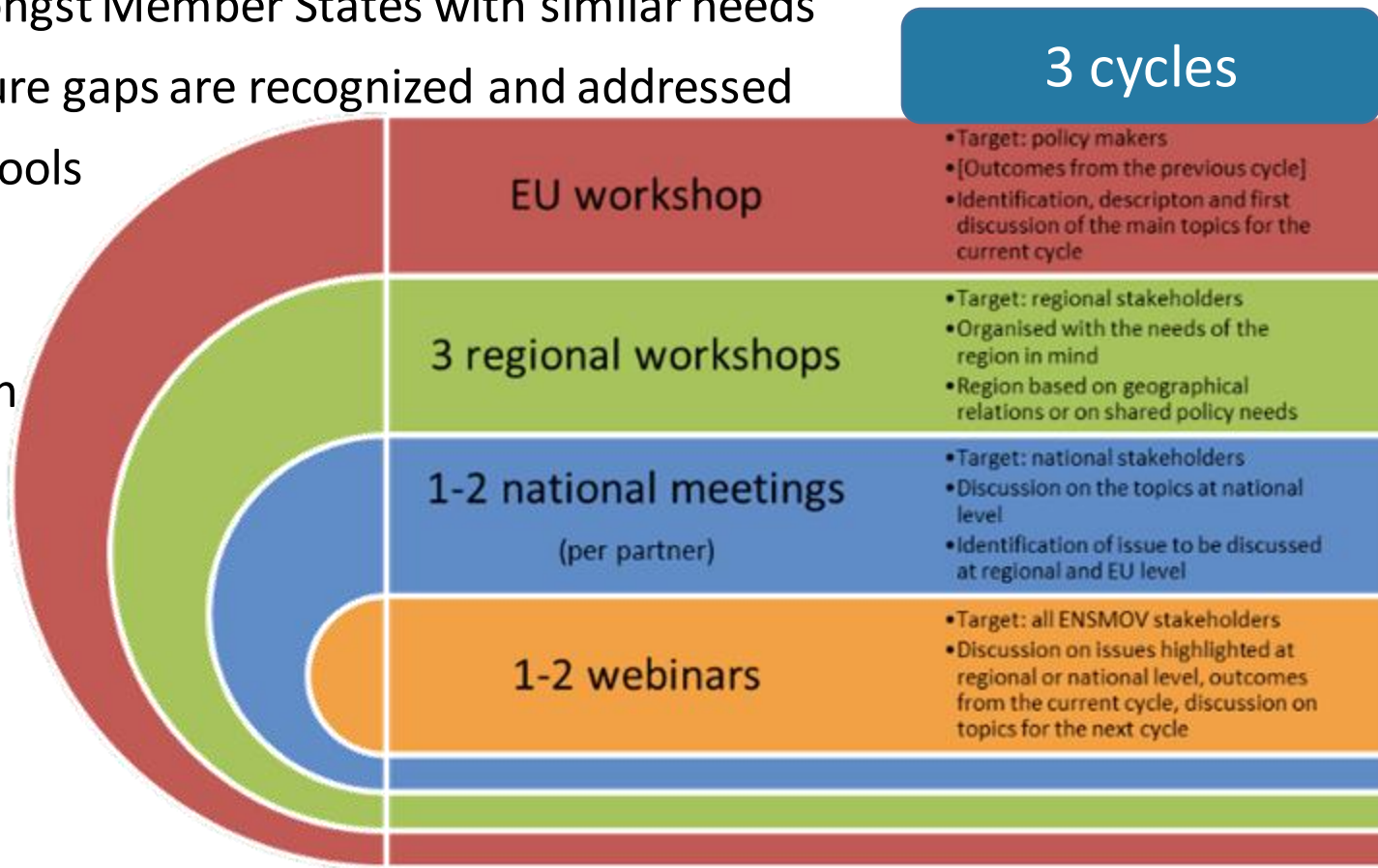


- ✓ Both projects target at the Monitoring and Verification schemes of Member States

- ✓ Specific elements of MRV schemes tackled (such as sampling, protocols etc)

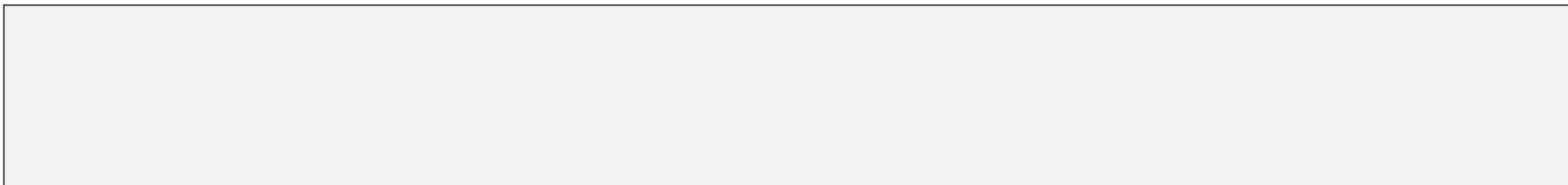
Examples of challenges faced

- ✓ Blend of national, regional and EU workshops
- ✓ Exchanges amongst Member States with similar needs
- ✓ Surveys to ensure gaps are recognized and addressed
- ✓ Guidance and tools developed to overcome gaps in policy implementation
